

Maria I. Nardi has over 16 years experience in the private and public sector in the fields of urban design, landscape architecture, park planning, architecture, and preservation. In the private sector, she received the University of Miami School of Architecture Alumna of the Year Award for her holistic, comprehensive park planning work as Chief of Planning and Research for Miami-Dade County, where she directed the vision for the Miami-Dade County Park and Open Space Master Plan; a vision for a more equitable, greener and healthier Miami-Dade County, and for her work as Chief of Urban Design for the City of Miami where she initiated Miami 21; a rewrite of the City's land development regulations from land use segregation to smart growth, mixed use regulations to promote a walkable, pedestrian friendly community. Ms. Nardi's community based planning initiatives and collaborative work also received the International Progressive Architecture Award for Urban Design, for the "Redland: A Preservation and Tourism Plan", a vision to preserve and rebuild the agricultural heritage of South Dade through Agritourism.
